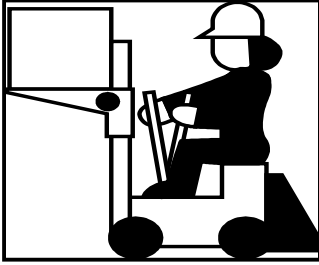


Transport around Abbeydale Industrial Hamlet.

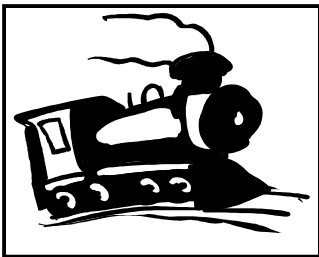

Now a days people use fork lift trucks to carry heavy loads.

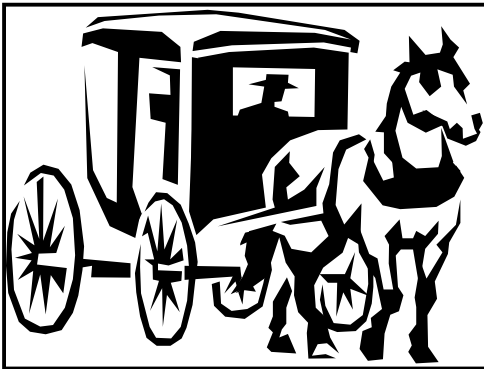
How did people carry heavy things around Abbeydale Industrial Hamlet?
